Clear Access Routes

- Keep your driveway and path to your propane tank clear of snow and ice.

Lower Your Thermostat

- Reduce your thermostat setting a few degrees when at home, and lower it further when you sleep or leave the house.

1. **FLAMES OUT:** Extinguish all cigarettes, fires, sparks, and electronic devices.
2. **PEOPLE OUT:** Evacuate everyone from the building—do not return until experts declare it safe.
3. **PROPANE OFF:** Contact us immediately at our 24/7 emergency line. Our experts will help you turn off your propane and check the tanks.
4. **CALL IN:** Contact your HVAC provider and do not go back inside until a licensed technician has inspected the entire system.
